Good afternoon everyone,

Park Terrace sustained a power outage yesterday that lasted until late afternoon. All email, telephone, wifi, and other methods of communication were down. The team did a great job in managing our residents needs with meal service, care assistance and comfort. We are looking into ways we can communicate with everyone should this happen again. The Resident Birthday Party, scheduled for last night, was postponed due to the power outage.

Residents are on the "Beyond Van Gogh" exhibition in Anaheim as I write these words.

I am being asked when we are holding our Flu shot clinic as well as the booster for CoVID. We have two dates, October 14 and 15 for the clinic. We will be sending out information soon with details.

Residents and associates will have the opportunity to get a flu shot and the booster for the Pfizer vaccine (at this time, only Pfizer has been approved by the FDA). It is important to note the recommendation is that the booster for CoVID is administered 8 months after the initial vaccine. For most of the team and residents, this would be in line with the October 14 and 15 dates we have set.

The CoVID protocols remain as follows:

All residents and associates will be tested weekly for CoVID using PCR test.

Masks are mandatory for all residents and associates and visitors.

All Visitors who have been vaccinated must show proof of vaccination.

Visitors who are unvaccinated may come into the community with proof of a negative PCR test which has been done within 72 hours. You may have the test done here at Park Terrace if you wish.

Any visitors wishing to spend the night must show proof of vaccination.

Everyone in the community continues to work together in following safety protocols. I am encouraging everyone and reminding them to please follow these protocols when outside of the community.

We are continuing to offer an active lifestyle for our residents while doing all we can to keep them safe and secure. Stay safe and healthy
