Dear Residents, Families and Associates,

I hope this letter finds you all in good health and spirits. I wanted to provide you with some updates on the recent developments at The Kensington. Firstly, I am pleased to announce that we have hired a new Sales Director, Charlise Nwoha. Charlise brings with her a wealth of experience and expertise, and we are excited to have her as a part of our team. Please join me in welcoming Charlise to our community.

In addition, I am thrilled to announce that Joseph Negrido has accepted the position of Resident Care Manager at The Kensington. Joseph has been doing excellent work at our sister Kisco community and will be transitioning to The Kensington on May 1st. He will be focused on managing and supporting memory care, and we are confident that he will bring his skills and knowledge to provide the best care for our residents. We are also actively recruiting executive directors, and we hope to make an announcement soon on that front.

I also wanted to provide a brief summary of the recent survey you all participated in. We received a lot of helpful suggestions and feedback from the survey, and we have taken note of the top five items that stood out to us:

2. Activities: Several residents mentioned wanting more attention to be paid to activities, scheduling, and providing opportunities for residents to socialize and enjoy themselves.

3. Maintenance: A few residents mentioned that the overall appearance and maintenance of the community could be improved.

4. Staffing: There were several comments about staffing shortages and inconsistent training among staff members, especially in the dining room.

5. Communication: Many residents mentioned wanting more transparency and communication about changes and updates to the community.

We are taking these suggestions seriously and have already started working on improving these areas. We appreciate your feedback and will continue to work towards making The Kensington the best place it can be for all of our residents. Kensy Capers

There were two “happenings” last month that I wanted to feature in today’s column: (1) The hammering above us: I checked with Dean, our Environmental Services Director (fancy title for the man who keeps our building and property up to snuff). He says the roof system was nearly 30 years old and it was time for some refurbishment. The granular material of the parapets (center roofs) needed redoing so we could avoid major leaks when the rains come. All the roof drains were checked and cleared of debris, and the flat roof seal coating was reapplied after a power washing.

The shingles that needed replacing were concrete-based material as is that of the new ones. Pictured are the men as they did the roof work. In refurbishing the property, Dean found it necessary also to have the uneven walkways around the building squared away. And you’ve all seen the beautiful new hall lights installed – same size, but brighter lighting than the old ones.

(2) On the delightful trip to the Golden Gate Bridge and Sausalito (Spanish for “small willow grove”) were 13 of us residents and our driver, Kim, and organizer, Kayla. We were lucky to have Chick on the trip, because for 16+

years, he has been a volunteer San Francisco City Guide and so we learned all about the design, engineering and building of the bridge. (City Guides is a non-profit program of the SF Public Library that keeps its guides of all ages and backgrounds trained through lectures and workshops.) It was a beautiful but cold day so we were all thankful for the warm bus and the cozy lunch restaurant, the Trident. Here’s a picture of a few bus riders, the bridge itself, and some of us at lunch. The Trident was right on the shoreline, with great views of the hill of Sausalito and the bay and land by and in it.

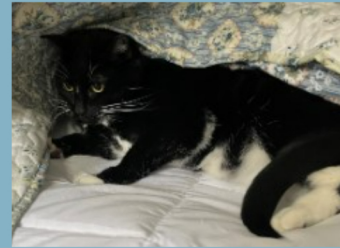

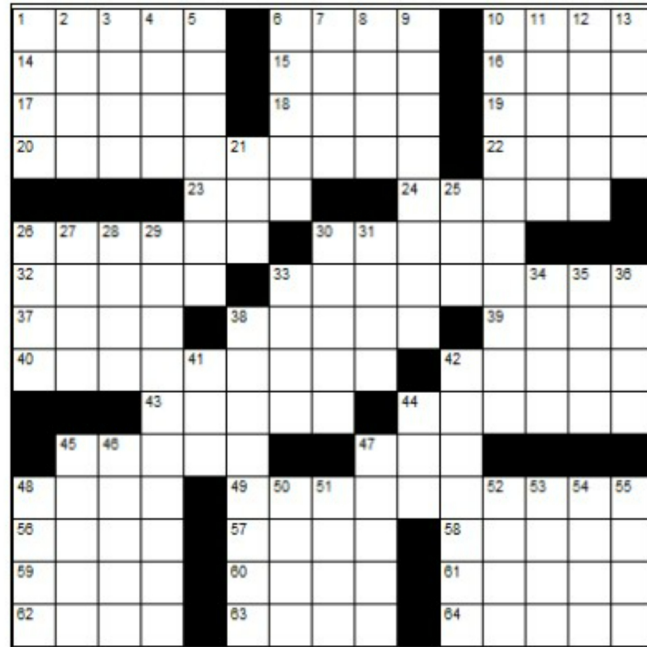
